It's my pleasant privilege to submit the brief annual report of the year 2023-2024. 2023-2024 was a year of great challenges and promises for the under privileged rural and tribal community. We have got an opportunity to serve the Irular Non-hills Tribal, a primitive tribal community through constructing sanitary family toilets. We also served the vulnerable poor Dalit children through educational support programme and providing evening supplementary education programme. People infected / affected by HIV/AIDS require nutrition supplementation and that has been provided to them during this year. Hundreds of distressed women and the women victims of domestic violence given counselling and streaming them in the society was also done during this year. Target intervention programme on HIV/AIDS programme focused on Hot spot places of 7 blocks in Tiruvannamalai district. In addition to the above funded activities, we have implemented few other awareness programmes through Local Resource Mobilisation (LRM) and community sponsors. The programme details are attached herewith for your information.

Nutrition Supplementation for HIV / AIDS infected / affected children, Women and Transgender



Tiruvannamalai is the vulnerable city of migrants, visitors pilgrims and Tourist come for various purposes. Millions of people come to Tiruvannamalai during the Full moon day and on the weekends.



The social intervention and social indulgence is more which has increased the transmission process of HIV/AIDS. The vulnerable HIV/AIDS victims are from the poor socio-economic status. The daily wage earners, widows and migrants are the vulnerable victims of HIV/AIDS. These people are living with poverty and hunger.

HIV infected / affected group of people require nutrition supplementation for their sustained health status. If they are not taking adequate nutrition food, their C.D.4 level will be declined and the ART Therapy may not be effective. HIV / AIDS infected / affected people are from the socially and economically poor community in Tiruvannamalai District. So, we identified 50 widows from the target community who are vulnerable and required nutrition supplementation. These widows received Rs.1000 worth of nutrition materials which includes the following.

- ♦ Rice 10 kg.
- ♦ Dhal ½ kg.
- ♦ Wheat flour 1 kg.
- ♦ Cooking oil (groundnut oil) 1 litre.
- ♦ Chilli powder – 100 gram
- ♦ Pepper – 100 gram
- ♦ Turmeric powder – 100 gram

Those widows expressed their need for sarees. So, we distributed one saree for each. This programme was implemented jointly by Mr. Rama Perumal, Ms. Justin Vidya and Mr. Kulandai Jesuraja. This project support was provided by Ms. Barbara Coaro, Studio progetto soc coop socials, Italy.



Construction of Sanitary Toilets for Irular Non-Hills Tribal community

The Irular Tribes are the unnoticed primitive tribe. Once they were living in in the forest, catching the snakes, extracting its skin and poison, helpful for their livelihood since, It has a good market value. After some years it was banned under the protection act, their livelihood was questioned and their biological existence was threatened.

So, they came down to the plains. They were unnoticed by the village people and over by government. The extracted the place for shelter near road side, Temple side and the public property. Eventually due to the social pressure, government also provided some land for their house construction. They built a little house within their means, without the provision of family toilets. The primitive Irular community people are socio- economically poor and vulnerable but their family size is bigger than others.

They do not have family toilets since

- ✳ Lack of awareness (knowledge)
- ✳ Lack of affordability (economically poor)
- ✳ Lack of knowledge about the maintenance of sanitary toilets
- ✳ Lack of technology
- ✳ Lack of trained man power in this community
- ✳ Lack of hygiene.
- ✳ They are giving least priority for sanitary toilet
- ✳ Culturally feeling comfortable in the open air defecation and they are used to that.

So the initial survey was made and assessed their practices and created awareness on the need for sanitary toilets. We identified and selected 65 beneficiaries among Irular community based on the following criteria

- ✳ Availability of space for toilets
- ✳ Interest to utilise the toilet 100%.
- ✳ Felt the need for family toilets with reference to the need for young women, children and aged people.
- ✳ Participating in the process of construction by mobilising their manual work (labour as their beneficiary) construction.
- ✳ Co-operating with Mason, Site Engineer etc., towards the completion of the project.

The construction committee was formed by 10 members with the participation of beneficiaries, Panchayat raj institution and SINAM NGO.

The project was completed in October 2023 and it was handed over to the project beneficiaries.

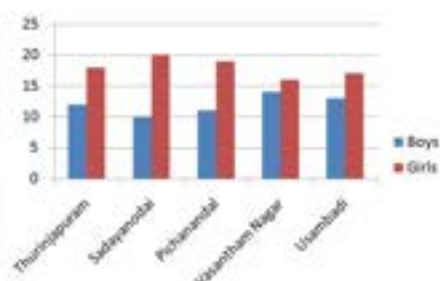

Sponsorship programme for poor children's education

150 poor Dalit children come under the sponsorship programme. They are from 5 Dalit villages. The details are as follows:

These children are given supplementary education in the evening by the qualified teachers. These teachers helped the children in their studies through evening classes.

The Children educational development is based on the cognitive domain (Knowledge) Affective domain (attitude) and psycho motor domain (skill). They underprivileged rural dalit children are lagging behind that K.A.S (Knowledge, Attitude and Skill). In order to overcome this short coming, the supplementary educations were informed 15 years before. Every year 150 Children from 5 villages were helped by the qualified teachers for these educations through different curricular, co curricular and extracurricular activities.

- Completing their home work
- Completion of recitation topics / poems
- Improving hand writing
- Improving their IQ by discussing general knowledge topics.
- Spell checks
- Solving the mathematic problems.
- Supervisor study
- Helping them in their school tests / term tests etc.

The children were given the needed note books, stationary materials like pen, pencil, sharpener, eraser and scale, school bag, T-shirt were given to children along with the evening coaching.

This has been supported by Dr. Evelien De Hoop from Netherlands.





Family Counselling Centre

Women are the backbone of every family and they are primarily responsible for family management. But in the transition society, women are educated, earning their livelihood and taking decisions about children's health, education, development etc. It has resulted in role conflict and unhappiness among families. This was the source of misery in many households. Conflict between spouses causes women to be sidelined and overlooked in the family development process.

SINAM NGO has been implemented this family counselling to women for the last 16 years. The women victims of domestic violence, distressed women and the women affected by natural calamities are helped to start their new life with help of this centre. During this reporting year 284 women were benefited. These women are from the background of dowry harassment, economic crisis, extra marital relationship victims, drug addicts, domestic violence. Mental and physical torture, property / wealth issues, mental separation, legal torture, delayed justice etc.



There is a sub-committee with the following members, provided medical, legal, advisory, developmental rehabilitative services. They regularly meet them and give their assessment about various services.

This is supported by Central Social Welfare Board, Ministry of Women and Child, New Delhi.

TANSACS – HIV / AIDS Target Intervention Programme

The target intervention programme was implemented in the following 7 Blocks of this District.

1. Tiruvannamalai
2. Thandrapattu
3. Chengam
4. Pudupalayam
5. Thurinjapuram
6. Kilpennathur
7. Kalasapakkam

There were 70 hotspots in all 7 Blocks and has been reduced to 25 active hotspots where the workers are active and dedicated.

Target intervention project focus on the following

- Testing and treating well
- Awareness creation on HIV / AIDS
- No new infections in the project area
- Stopping stigma and discrimination
- Accepting preventive measures
- Counselling and comprehensive care
- Save lives.



The project focuses on 580 female sex workers, 714 male sex with male, 51 Transgender. Totally the number covers around 1345. The team is expected to distribute condom, assist them in testing and counselling and linking with other service providers including Government / NGO / Hospital services. 100% ART Adherence is achieved except are, who is transferred to Chennai and that person will be carrying out the follow up services. During this reporting year, the C.D.4 level has been increased from 840 to 1140 (average) and the weight is increased from 48 kg to 55 kg (average). The awareness level on the disease transmission process is increased and the incidence HIV/AIDS has been declined gradually in Tiruvannamalai district. The suspected cases are voluntarily going for testing and to the counselling centres. The risk group of young people, migrants and illiterate and construction workers have received the awareness on the prevention of HIV/AIDS through ABC approach (Abstinences, Being faithful, for the spouse and Condom promotion). To effectively prevent and control HIV/AIDS.

SINAM has been working with Government, various service providers, volunteers, Community leaders elected leaders and other stake holders in Tiruvannamalai district.

This project is supported by Tamil Nadu State Aids Control Society (TANSACS), Chennai Government of Tamil Nadu.

Through local resource mobilisation and community sponsors, the following programmes are carried out.



Disabled Skill Training and Awareness Meeting

An awareness meeting on skill training for people with disability was organised in Allappanur village of Thandrampet block. As a result of this, 15 persons with disabilities enrolled their names on Tailoring skill training. Both men and with disabilities participated in the six months of training at Allappanur village in Thandrampet block. Analysed the issues and the human rights violation of Disabled women and the ways to prevent the violation and legal remedies.



Analyse the consequences for different types of disability and to tap Government resources for their rehabilitation.

To discuss the steps involved in organizing special groups for the development of Disabled women in Tamil Nadu.

It creates remarkable output in the working area, thus our SINAM has planned to organize more program for the Disabled welfare like this in the upcoming years also.

Consumers Awareness Programme

One day consumer's awareness programme was conducted one day in Radhapuram village at Thandrampet block. This awareness programme was focused on the following below.

Packet label. The packet label should possess the date of manufacturing, name of the product, weight, price and different proportions of various products with quantity involved in the preparation of final product.

Expiry date. The expiry date should be printed and that should be distinctly visible to all.

Green label. The product should indicate what extent that the product is eco friendly and what amount of chemicals and preservatives used for the production of the product.



Child Rights Awareness Programme

The child rights awareness programme was conducted in the following 5 villages. Totally 200 children were participated in the programme. The details are given below:

- Right to live (Biological existence)
- Right to education
- Right to participation
- Right to development
- Right to be free from child labour and child marriage
- Right to gender equality and free from gender discrimination.



International Women's Day Programme

International Women's Day programme was held in 5 different villages on five different dates. Totally around 500 women participated in the International Women's Day programme. All the resource persons were women and it was co-ordinated by Ms. D.Vasanthi Community Organiser. Various awareness generation programmes were carried out in the form of singing songs, dance, traditional folk media, street play etc. The self help group women involved various programmes of having both educational entertainment and awareness values. Several prizes were given to the self help groups for their performances in different fields of work. The guests and invitees were given the memento in memory of the day



Road Safety Awareness Programme

Road Safety Awareness Programme was organised at Thandrapattu on 22-01-2024 around 210 students were participated in the road safety awareness programme. During the programme, following topics are covered.

- Road signal and its meaning.
- Road safety rules
- Emergency contact numbers for Ambulance service, police service and fire service numbers
- Golden rules of road accidents
- Need for driving with licence, helmet and seat belt (in case of 4 wheelers)
- Road travel offences and the details of penalty / punishments.
- Safety rules for safe travel.



Red Hand day programme

Red Hand day awareness programme was organised in 5 different villages. During and after Covid 19 pandemic disaster, many children are used for child labour and that too on hazardous working situation. They are involved in dangerous work like weapon use training, weapon manufacturing training through YouTube/online instruction. They are often used in weapon manufacturing and the use of weapon during internal conflicts between religious beliefs, caste, community issues. Since the children are minors, they escape with minimum punishment or treatment package. So, the anti social elements and the militants are using children. In view of this, the children should get proper awareness about child labour. So, this programme was organised in 5 different villages in 5 different dates. Around 200 children participated in the programme.



Tree plantation for Environmental development

In view of the climate change, deforestation and global warming, there is a need for planting more trees and to protect the trees. When we cut the permanent tree, we must plant at least 2 permanent trees. In Thuringapuram Block, we planted 1000 Traditional endangered permanent trees through the women's self help group. 1000 saplings are distributed and planted in the 5 villages of Thuringapuram Block. Environmental protection and bio- diversity conservation practices in their home level Tree Saplings Distribution were also made. About 85 more Trees saplings were planted in our working area during this program. The SHG members and Community volunteers were actively participated in Tree plantation and biodiversity matters in their locality. The focus was particularly given to 3R. Such as Reduce, Reuse and Recycle. The self help group, youth groups and children group are the ambassadors of combating the global warming deforestation and climate change. Growing more trees and reducing deforestation is one of the strategies that the community can follow without any difficulties. Afforestation helps the prevention of desertification and improves the environment security. It was planned and implemented through the people to achieve the environmental awareness creation through education. Environmental development through community action and environment security through enhancing the bio diversity, conservation of national resources.

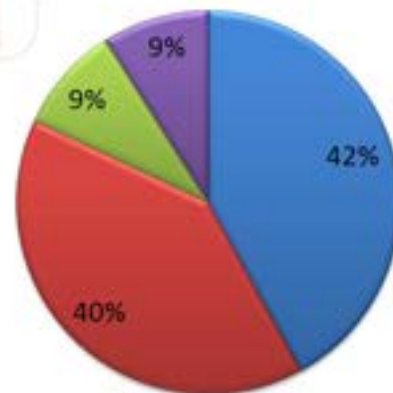
